

- Launched the "Stand Stronger" Citizenship Awareness Campaign with a video from President Obama and the website committocitizenship.org
- Expanding citizenship outreach partnerships with municipal governments
- In 2015, USCIS awarded nearly \$10 million in Citizenship and Integration Grants to 40 organizations in 26 states to help aspiring citizens prepare for naturalization
- Launched a Citizenship Public Awareness Campaign to promote awareness of the rights, responsibilities, and importance of United States citizenship, and resources for permanent residents and community organizations
- Developing online naturalization preparation and application filing tools
- Allowing applicants to pay naturalization fees with credit cards
- Collaborating with the U.S. Department of Agriculture to increase services in rural communities
- Combating the Unauthorized Practice of Immigration Law (UPIIL)
- Sharing federal information with new citizens at naturalization ceremonies
- Increasing Low-Cost Legal Services Capacity through new regulations
- Identifying opportunities to inform permanent residents of potential eligibility for naturalization



Wage and Hour Division Priority

- Enforcement of federal wage laws
 - Fair Labor Standards Act (FLSA)
 - Family and Medical Leave Act (FMLA)
 - Migrant & Seasonal Agricultural Protection Act (MSPA)
 - Davis Bacon Act (DBA/DBRA)
 - Service Contract Act (SCA)
 - H-1B - Temporary employment of foreign workers in specialty occupations
 - H-2A - Temporary employment of foreign workers in agriculture
 - H-2B - Temporary employment of foreign workers in non-agricultural work

Enforcement Activities

- WHD enforces federal labor laws in the US regardless of the immigration status of workers.
- Bitmicro in Fremont, CA: BW's due to employees \$161,268 for minimum wage and overtime violations. WHD's investigation determined employees from the Philippines were paid in Philippine pesos rather than USD.

Enforcement Activities

- Joint investigation between WHD and OIG with guidance from DOJ resulted in the indictment of the restaurant owner of Hong Kong Lounge, located in San Francisco, CA.
 - Owner indicted for concealing material fact from a government agency and interfering with commerce by threats of economic harm to employees

Enforcement Activities

- Porras End Post, located in Napa Valley, CA, was investigated by WHD and it was determined employees were owed \$19,000.
 - Housing conditions did not meet standards
 - Field conditions did not meet standards



The Charleston Passport Center in Charleston, SC and Special Issuance Agency in Washington, DC are not open to the public.



Routine & Expedite Service

With **Routine Service** the customer will receive his/her passport approximately **6 weeks** from the time the application was executed.

Refer to travel.state.gov for the most up-to date processing time information

With **Expedited Service** the customer will receive his/her passport approximately **3 weeks** from the time the application was executed.

Expedited Service at an Agency takes 3-8 business days (depending on the need of the customer).



Passport Facilities

Customers with urgent travel plans should apply at a Regional Passport Agency or Center. In order to do so they must:

- Be traveling in **14 days or less**
- Pay the \$60 Expedite Fee at the agency and provide proof of travel




San Francisco Passport Agency Outreach

PT/SF maintains excellent outreach relationships with the community not only by providing excellent service at their new facility but also working with various organizations and groups within their region to make it convenient to apply for a U.S. passport.

For the past 15 years, CA/PPT/SF has accepted approximately 800 passport applications per month at DHS/CIS naturalization ceremonies.

In 2007, we experienced an unprecedented surge in passport applications, issuing over 18 million passports as a result of the Western Hemisphere Travel Initiative (WHTI). Nearly 10 years later, those passports are beginning to expire, and we have been experiencing increasing demand for passport Renewals.



U.S. citizens are required to present a **U.S. Passport Book** to enter the United States when traveling by air.

A **U.S. Passport Card**, can be used when entering the United States at **land** or **sea** ports of entry from Canada, Mexico, the Caribbean, or Bermuda.



Passport cards are:

- **NOT** valid for travel by air
- Valid for entry to the United States at land border crossings and sea ports-of-entry when arriving from Mexico, Canada, Caribbean, and Bermuda



Passport Card

Passport cards are:



- **NOT** valid for travel by air
- Valid for entry to the United States at land border crossings and sea ports-of-entry when arriving from Mexico, Canada, Caribbean, and Bermuda
- Valid for 10 years for adults (age 16 and older) 5 years for minors
- Wallet Size

Note: Citizenship and identity requirements are the same as the passport book.

STEP is a free service to allow U.S. citizens and nationals traveling abroad to enroll their trip with the nearest U.S. Embassy of Consulate

Benefits of Enrolling in STEP

- Receive important information from the Embassy about safety conditions in your destination country, helping you make informed decisions about your travel plans
- Help the U.S. Embassy contact you in an emergency, whether natural disaster, civil unrest, or family emergency
- Help family and friends get in touch with you in an emergency


